The CCC Camps of Clinton County, PA 1933 - 1942



May 1933 - trains began pulling in to depots throughout Clinton County loaded with CCC Boys from towns and cities across Pennsylvania and from the state of Alabama. Companies of 200 men in their late teens and early twenties marched into the woods near places like Westport, North

Bend, Farrandsville, Rauchtown, and Loganton to build the Army-styled camps that we commemorate in this driving tour.
